Worship Through Pain

God is faithful no matter the circumstances. This is my position. This is my belief, and I worship it accordingly.

In October I tore the MCL, ACL, Meniscus, and other assorted things in my knee. I've been in constant pain since. A "little mercy" from the Lord is that I have learned a new sympathy for those in pain and I'm grateful for that.

So, what do I do when I don't "feel" like worshipping? The Holy Spirit led me last year to memorize a scripture, Habakkuk 3:17-19. I didn't know at the time how it would apply to this season:

Habakkuk 3:17-19
(17) Though the fig tree may not blossom,
Nor fruit be on the vines;
Though the labor of the olive may fail,
And the fields yield no food;
Though the flock may be cut off from the fold,
And there be no herd in the stalls—
(18) Yet I will rejoice in the Lord,
I will joy in the God of my salvation.
(19) The Lord God is my strength;
He will make my feet like deer's feet,
And He will make me walk on my high hills.

My response to the time of pain: "I will rejoice in the Lord; I will joy in the God of my salvation." You don't have to feel good to hold your position of faith and worship accordingly. You don't have to always have a smile on your face to worship. Let your heart remain steadfast knowing in whom you have put your faith.

Some of us will have relief from the physical or emotional pain in this lifetime. For some, the sweet relief will be on the other side with Jesus. That is for God to determine. Regardless, let this be your position of faith: "I will rejoice in the Lord, I will joy in the God of my salvation."

Also, I know that this kind of pain is a training ground. There are persecuted believers around the world who live daily in danger, in hunger, and separation from family and other believers. I pray that God will take this brief season and work patience in my spirit to be able to withstand anything that comes against me in this spiritual war. This morning my wife Jenna mentioned the rib I broke earlier in the year. "Seems like nothing compared to this." Yep. That experience was like the lion and bear David defeated while he was watching the sheep. These experiences gave David confidence in his God as he offered up his courage to face the evil meant against his flock.

God, please use our trials to build us into stronger warriors in the spiritual battle. Give us the strength to hold rank and praise you no matter the circumstances. And please comfort the afflicted- those who are in physical pain and those who suffer in the spiritual war around the world.

- 2 Corinthians 1:3-7
- (3) Praise be to the God and Father of our Lord Jesus Christ, the Father of compassion and the God of all comfort
- (4) who comforts us in all our troubles, so that we can comfort those in any trouble with the comfort we ourselves receive from God.
- (5) For just as we share abundantly in the sufferings of Christ, so also our comfort abounds through Christ.
- (6) If we are distressed, it is for your comfort and salvation; if we are comforted, it is for your comfort, which produces in your patient endurance of the same sufferings we suffer.
- (7) And our hope for you is firm because we know that just as you share in our sufferings, so also you share in our comfort.
