Dear Church Family,

There is an expression that is used when people see things as better than they actually are or were. It's called looking at things through "rose colored glasses." I don't suppose a touch of optimism really hurts anything but making a habit of giving circumstances and situations a better grade than they really deserve can cause a lot of problems. The biggest one being that it can prevent people from making changes that make a difference.

There is a much better way to live in happiness and contentment than to pretend that things are good that really aren't. It's called a mindset of gratitude. One can be totally honest about hardships, grief, loss, and difficulty while at the same time being grateful for what is good and going well, and even for the good that God can and will bring out of sad or hurtful occurrences.

Similarly, God brings good out of situations that seem horrible and sad. The prison sentence that a desperate young man receives for a crime he committed, may be the beginning of his walk into the Savior's arms.

So, a grateful person knows that there are some downsides to even wonderful blessings, and that God brings good out of even the most oppressive situations. The true believer also understands that whatever this life throws at us, that God will walk with us through it and ultimately bring us home to a place that He has prepared for us!

As we lean towards another Thanksgiving Day, it might be a great time to get back on track with the biblical admonition- "...in everything give thanks, for this is the will of God in Christ Jesus for you." (! Thess. 5:18)
